

Douglas County helps reduce COVID-19 transmission by closing facilities to the public

Nearly all county services will continue during closure, including more than 40 online services.

Douglas County is closely monitoring this public health crisis with a focus on the safety of our employees and those we serve. With this goal in mind, Douglas County has therefore closed most of our buildings to public access, doing our part reduce the chances of COVID 19 transmission.

While the physical buildings may be closed to the public, we are continuing to provide County services. We want to clarify that all County employees should work with their supervisor to determine if they are to report to work or work remotely beginning Tuesday March 17.

While the Douglas County Justice Center and the Highlands Ranch Sheriff's Substation will remain open to the public, the Sheriff's Office is encouraging citizens' use of online services.

County departments and offices will be staffed to support county operations. County services will continue during this closure, the duration of which has yet to be determined.
